Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2016-2017

School Context

Barley Mow Primary School is an average sized primary school. The percentage of pupils entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) is more than double the national average (Sch 52.6%, Nat 25.2%).

Objectives of Pupil Premium Spending

Pupil Premium is funding additional to the main school budget. The grant is allocated to the following groups of children: pupils currently known to be eligible for free school meals; Pupils known to be eligible for free school meals in any of the previous six years; looked after children; children adopted from Local Authority care and families with parents in the armed forces. Schools have the freedom to spend the funding in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for these pupils.

Our key objective in using the Pupil Premium Grant is to narrow the gap between disadvantaged children and other children classed as non- disadvantaged.

In making provision for the Pupil Premium pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be disadvantaged. We also recognise that not all pupils who are disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals.
